- Ash Wednesday -

- *Thought by some to mirror the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert being tempted as well as a time of his fasting.
- * The marking of ashes go back in time to the Old Testament for those who were mourning a death or were sorrowful for some grievous event.
- *Ashes used in current year are made from the burned palm branches from the previous year and mixed with a little water (and sometimes little olive oil)
- * The 40 days of Lent do NOT include Sundays as they were and are a day of Resurrection celebration.

Winter in the north country calls for hibernation and stillness yet we push our bodies up against the darkness. Lent is a season of the body, a time of preparation of plumbing the darkness. Grace and peace,

Easter is early this year – March 27. That means Lent is early. In fact Lent starts with Ash Wednesday February 10, 2016. I thought we just had Christmas and we are already talking about Lent and Easter. Can't we just slow down a little bit and have a break before the solemnity of Lent? I'm not ready to face it yet!

That's the problem for so many of us. We think we have to be ready. After all, Lent is 40 days of solemn worship and hymns. It is 40 days of bitter wine at communion and no halleluiahs. For some it is 40 days of giving up something we enjoy to see how well we resist temptation.
