New Years Day brings many of us to make resolutions that, like last year we coulda, woulda, shoulda but didn't fulfill or make any attempt to actually do. Or our resolve lasted but a few days and we caved into our weaker

natures.

Most of us make resolutions to lose weight, exercise more, eat healthy, cut back on chocolate, spend more time with family or friends. The list is as varied as there are people, isn't it? Now what does this have to do with our faith walk? How do we re-solve or re-form or deepen our faith or reawaken our relationships with Jesus and each other?

Did you know that there are over 4000 words with 're' used as a prefix and that 're' comes from the ancient Greek and means to go 'back again' What does all this Re- stuff have to do with Epiphany and the church or us as individuals or collectively?

If we recall that Epiphany is a "Eureka" (I found it or I get it) and sometimes called an 'aha' moment in time where enlightenment comes to us in a revelation of a greater truth, such as the Magi had when they encountered the Christ Child for the first time. They had to re-think their beliefs and replot their travel plans. In our era, many orthodox Christians celebrate this visit on January 6 each year also named the 12th night.

When we travel into Ukiah (our deep valley) of the scriptures we discover that there is always a greater truth waiting for us to discover. We often have a breakthrough that follows a process of significant thought when this new information comes to light. Our aha moment!

As a people who embrace a Lutheran understanding in our theology, we confess that we are a re-forming church, a restorative church, refreshed church, and a re-doing church. So it is that we must re-consider or re-trace and re-center ourselves in the scriptures.



So this year, instead of making all those resolutions that we know we will not keep or have no intentions of keeping, lets resolve to deepen our faith walk in some manner.

What would happen if all of us were to change and what could we achieve when all of us should happen to do what Lutherans do best and that is to be a confessing reformation congregation.

Some great ideas to consider for our edification and growth are:

- * Bring your bible to church every Sunday and read along with the lessons and gospel from your bible.
- *Double your daily prayer time from what you currently practice.
- *Take time to offer table grace in public spaces
- *Worship occasionally with the people at the opposite service you normally attend.
- *Invite a person or family to church at least once a month, every month.
- *Embrace and accept changes gracefully.
- *Complement someone on what they did right and not criticize what went wrong.
- *Celebrate your uniqueness, God does!
- *Expect and embrace the unexpected gifts of Grace that the Lord has for you.

Epiphany does come when your woulda, coulda, shoulda, gets turned inside out and priorities are placed in the right order.
