
Wheat and Tares (Pats Pondering from the Pews)



Wow! The weeds are growing along with the beautiful green, green grass of this summer. It is refreshing to see green lawns after so many years of drought in the Ukiah Valley. New growth can often be discerned on plant life by the shades of green on its branches. New growth seems to be a lighter shade while the

more mature a darker hue of green. Then there are the weeds that keep sprouting up among the desired plants, they too are often green in color and when growing among the wheat appear to be wheat but in fact are not. They are called bearded darnels or tares.
